KEYNOTE SPEAKER

DR. STEPHEN B. THOMAS

Professor, University of Maryland School of Public Health Director, University Maryland Center for Health Equity



One of the nation's leading scholars in the effort to eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities, Dr. Stephen B. Thomas has applied his expertise to design community engaged interventions that break the cycle of risk factors associated with premature illness and death associated with chronic diseases such as hypertension, type II diabetes, youth violence and depression.

Dr. Thomas is the founding director of the University of Maryland Center for Health Equity, an NIH Center of Excellence on Race, Ethnicity and Health Disparities Research funded by the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities. With the mission to advance the elimination of health disparities and achievement of health equity through innovative research, teaching and service, the center works to eliminate racial disparities to achieve health equity among residents in the state of Maryland, and increase the inclusion of racial and ethnic minorities in health research through our Building Trust Initiative.
